Editor's Note. This is the first in a series of articles describing the set up and formation of the many stations in this area, especially those who have been among the pioneers in Ham radio.

Amateur Radio Station VE3NN----ex VE3AJS.

Was first bitten by the bug when in 1935 Eddie Goodier, VE3XQ, raised a 70 ft. mast in his back yard. Curiosity prompted a visit to the shack.

From then on my aim was to become a "Ham". Got my ticket the following year with the call VE3AJS. Operated 40 mtrs with a TNT circuit using P.P. 45's. The receiver, three tubes, regenerative. Soon graduated to an 2I0 then a pair of T20's. Later went to phone on 75 and 20 with a pair of T40 Receiver was now a Hallicrafter S9-- Then came the war-- After hostilities ceased went on IO with P.P. 8I3's. When IO folded tried 20 and 75 meters again. Took a great deal of interest in 6 meters and worked about 30 states using P.P.P.24G's running 300 watts. Worked IO and 6 mobile with good results. Have had beams on 6, IO, and 20 meters. Present rig uses parallel 8I3's, completely TVI'd on 20 running 375 watts, 8JK beam, R.M.E. 69 receiver with DB 20 preselector and VHF I52/a converter. Took I6 years hamming to accumulate WAS. WAC, and RCC.
