

Minutes of QARC Meeting - January 20, 2025

The meeting was brought to order by club President Dave Ackerman VE3OX.

Dave welcomed members and guests to our first meeting of the new year. Dave made mention of **Blair VE3BCA** who has moved to the area recently and has been a regular at our Saturday breakfast meetings and also **Chris VA3SM** who hasn't been to a meeting in person for quite sometime. For those not familiar Chris is our Webmaster. Nice to see you both at the meeting!

A moment of silence was observed for two **Silent Keys**:

Don Davenport VE3BPL, who passed away on January 1, 2025. Don served as Club Treasurer from 1971-1973 and Emergency Coordinator in 1972.

Kevin Reid VA3GSI passed away on Nov. 21, 2024. Kevin had been a member for quite a few years. Eric Reid VE3GSI spoke a few words about his brother Kevin to club members.

A **motion** was made by Dennis VA3DWK to accept the **November minutes** as published in the news letter and was seconded by Don VE3LYX. The motion was **carried**.

Attila VE3KAS made **Treasurer's report** to the members, stating that funds from the PERC club had been transferred with a total of just over \$7000.00 in the account. He also reported that we are up from 78 members to 88 members. A **motion** to accept Attila's Treasurer's report was made by Tim VE3UO and seconded by Jim VE3VDQ. The **motion** carried.

Matthew VE3FL made a report on the **wind up** of the **Prince Edward Radio Club**. He stated that the Corporation has been dissolved and has officially been wound up with the website still carrying on. Matthew will contact Chris VA3SM about how to merge or otherwise use the website, google space and email addresses. Also the Prince **Edward County ARES** group has been wound up with Peter VE3UR trying to get a list of people and equipment together to organize.

January Minutes (cont'd)

Dave VE3OX spoke about **RAC** membership and club dues, encouraging members to to also become RAC members. The organization does a lot for the ham radio community and only has one paid employee which means most of the dues gets used for ham radio issues.

Matthew VE3FL spoke briefly about **UHF repeaters** and **DMR** ("Digital Mobile Radio"). It looks like the Fusion repeater that is presently at the Picton site will go back to Belleville and Matthew will set up a DMR repeater in Picton. Also, Kevin VE3KJN is getting ready to launch a **DMR repeater** just north of **Kingston** so we may see some new opportunities for digital in the near future.

Dave VE3OX asked if anyone would be interested in helping to teach some **classes** for the **Sea Cadets** as Matthew Batten VE3ZQW has relocated out of the area and they may need a hand.

Matthew VE3FL spoke on the need for a few volunteers for the **Kids of Steel Triathlon** held in Picton around the middle of June.

Dave VE3OX spoke on a few upcoming events. Winter Field Day https://winterfieldday.org/ has two locations being operated from. Bob VA3ACE and Phil VA3EFX are going to operate from Quinte Alliance Church located at 373 Bridge St. West in Belleville. Use the back door of the church. Also Sean VA3BZC and Robert VA3KRJ are going to be operating from The Loomis Conservation Area north of Brighton on Hwy #30.

Brad VA3CBU is operating from his home in Frankford as well and encourages people to drop in.

Looks like **Buffalo's on the Air** will be happening again this year on **Aug 9, 2025**. More details to follow.

Minutes of QARC Virtual Meeting Feb 17, 2025

The meeting was **brought to order** by **Dave VE3OX**. Dave welcomed members and guests to the virtual meeting. Angela Nugent and her son Noah Bower were guests in attendance and are in the process of studying for their ISED certificates

There are no silent keys to report for this meeting.

Dennis VA3DWK did not have the **minutes** ready from the January meeting but will be provided at a later date.

Dave VE3OX read a **Treasurer's report** from Attila VE3KAS stating that we had an opening balance of \$7130.47 with a credit of \$365.00 and then a debit of \$803.12 for RAC insurance for a balance \$6692.35. Matthew VE3FL made a **motion** to accept the Treasurer's report and it was seconded by Cameron VE3GVG. The motion was **carried**.

Bob VE3QWB reported that we had a request for **renewal** of membership from someone in Marmora and also a **QSL request** from someone in Texas. Some discussion as to whether to answer it or not to send back a QSL card. Dave VE3OX decided that we should respond and Bob VE3QWB will forward the renewal to Attila VE3KAS and the QSL request to Dennis VA3DWK.

Dave VE3OX gave a reminder to the members that there is an **upcoming election** in **May** so anyone that would be interested in an executive position please make it known to Tim VE3UO as he is our Past President and traditionally runs the election process. Dave also mentioned the fact that our May meeting would fall on the Monday of the May long weekend. The Sea Cadet office has assured us that we will have access to the hall for that day.

The **CW** course that Robert VA3KRJ was running has completed the formal lessons and is now practising for POTA and Contesting formats. Hopefully we will have a couple of students challenge the exam.

Dave VE3OX reported that we are still having issues with the **QAR repeater** but not as often as it was initially happening. Matthew VE3FL says that it is a work in progress and the changes he would like to make will require some time from Wil VA3JWO who has a work schedule to contend with. Matthew says he will contact him to see when they can set up a time to do the needed changes to try and solve the issues.

Dave VE3OX brought up the upcoming Field Day http://www.arrl.org/field-day and asked if we will be using the Car Club facilities in Ameliasburgh. The consensus was to use the Car club facilities again this year.

February Virtual Minutes (cont'd)

Matthew VE3FL started a **discussion** for Noah and Angela's benefit as to what **Field Day** is and entails. The discussion then went to the topic of CW and it's history as far as exam requirements and level of difficulty. Some people in attendance made the analogy that it is like a musical note and has a rhythm to it, while others suggested it is more of a repetitive type thing. Al VE3FZ made the analogy that it is like keyboarding, where you learn the various keys and eventually it becomes second nature or an automatic reflex like "muscle memory". Al also explained that it should be learned at speed with the slowing down of the process being done with the spaces in between the letters being slowed down. Dennis VA3DWK agreed with Al that his experience with the class that it became easier to copy characters when the process was sped up. Dave made mention of several Morse code teaching aids. He also mentioned that RAC offers several online courses for both Basic and Advanced programs.

Matthew VE3FL played a brief video clip created by Sean VA3BZC on Sean and Robert's Winter Field Day experience. Nicely done Sean!

Matthew VE3FL did a slide presentation On the **QAR move** and **installation** to it's new location at the Belleville City Police Tower. Slides included shots of the location and tower, present equipment of the Police, the installation process, various racks and hardware on the tower. The repeater is a Motorola MTR 3000. Matthew mentioned some of the cost savings we received from the coax cable from Wil VA3JWO and Dave VE3OX work on finding a better price on installer fees from Guthrie's https://www.guthries.com/ out of Barrie. A thank you to Dave and Wil for their hard work in saving so much money on the project! The actual install date was November 25, 2024. The antenna was installed at the 100 ft. Mark on the tower.

At the end of Matthew's presentation he thanked those involved in the project including Dave VE3OX for his work on installation bids, Wil VA3JWO for his procurement of the heliax coax and work on the cavities etc, Tim VE3UO for his work obtaining the site. Also Matthew VE3FL deserves a Huge thank you for all his work on this project as well. **Great job Gentlemen!!**

Bob VE3QWB asked Matthew if there is a room dedicated to emergency communications that we have access to in the police station. Matthew said he was unaware of any provision for that and turned the question over to Peter VE3UR. Peter said he wasn't sure where the set up would be but mentioned the Quinte Wellness Centre. Matthew noted that we have limited access to the building and it's mostly a by appointment type thing.

John VE3IIT made and offer to Noah and Angela for one of three Baofeng radios to have. They are making arrangements through email.

Dave closed the meeting noting 18 in attendance.
